JINGLE BELLS/SLEIGH RIDE



There are some songs that are so familiar, you can't remember ever not knowing them. This week we feature two popular songs, that fit that category perfectly.

"Sleigh Ride," by Leroy Anderson, was first recorded by The Boston Pops Orchestra, under the direction of Arthur Fiedler, in 1949. To this day, it remains one of the orchestra's signature pieces. The lyrics, by Mitchell Parish, were added the following year, and The Andrews Sisters were the first to record the song, accompanied by those lyrics.



Written and published in 1857, by James Lord Pierpont, "Jingle Bells" is the American song most commonly sung, around the entire world. The song has been immortalized by hundreds, upon hundreds of musicians, including Bing Crosby, Benny Goodman, Louis Armstrong, The Beatles, Judy Collins, Ella Fitzgerald, Barry Manilow, Luciano Pavarotti, Barbara Streisand, Frank Sinatra, Gwen Stefani, NSync, and even The Chipmunks!
